5. What does Pilate think of Jesus and "truth"? How are Pilate's questions like those of our time?
6. Who do the Jews want? What does Pilate want? What does Jesus want?
7. When you picture the story in your imagination, what emotions is Jesus feeling? What does his face look like as Pilate asks him questions or as the man hits him?
8. In your imagination what are the disciples feeling?

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
