The story of Jesus' birth is full of angels: they announce the birth of John to his parents Elizabeth and Zechariah, an angel of the Lord appears to Mary and to Joseph to announce the birth of their son, Jesus, and angels appear to the shepherds announcing the birth of the Messiah. Have you ever had an encounter with an angel? What is the history of angels and where do we encounter them in the biblical story? What is their purpose? Come join us during Advent as we consider the message of the angels! We will be decorating our sanctuary windows with angels and we would love for you to share one of your special angels to place in a window.

A Park at Oakland, really?

The Holy Cow Team, the Property Team, and the Session have spent considerable time studying the Holy Cow survey and what it reveals about our church. Despite our many missions and outreach to the community by allowing worthy groups like Scouts, AA, Board of Elections, neighborhood HOA meetings, and on and on to use our facilities, we still come up short. The survey results reflect that our Church is still more inward focused than outward focused. So, what can we do to spread the Gospel to more families within our community? One idea that we are seeking member input on is this:

Adjacent to and east of our church facilities is a 1-acre field where our storm water retention pond is located. This area is sparsely used by members and mostly forgotten. It could be used for future expansion, but that doesn't seem necessary in the near term. So, the idea is to build a nice picnic shelter, clean up the retention pond, design a walking trail around the property and the church grounds, install picnic tables, a few park benches and a grill, and other amenities that might make sense such as a horseshoe pit or a butterfly garden or a fire pit. The area has beautiful maturing trees that will enhance the experience of walking or picnicking or playing on this site. But if we do all that, how do we make it community focused and how in the world could a picnic shelter help us spread the gospel?

By allowing community access. We could install attractive signage to inform the public that "Oakland Park" was built by Oakland Presbyterian Church and can be used by Cleveland Community families and small groups to enjoy at no cost (donations welcomed) simply by reserving the space through the church office (or online). We could place other signage such as "A quiet place to enjoy God's creation and use everyday moments to connect our lives to Jesus." Could we install short prayer plaques along the walking trail? What is your idea? A small task force has been organized to begin studying the idea and developing a budget. Members so far are Sarah Leonard, Kitty Nappen, Tammy Pflum, Lanny Thomas, Wanda Watkins, Ed Williford, and Denton Lee. Larry Bailey, longtime Parks & Recreation Director in Clayton, has agreed to assist us. Some cleanup around the pond may start this winter, but the majority of the planning is ahead of us. Would you like to join us?

Confirmation Class Coming Soon!

Pastor Debbie will be holding a Confirmation class starting in February for all youth who are interested in officially joining Oakland as adult members. Confirmation offers attendees the opportunity to dive deeper into what they believe and why through study and experiences where they will get to explain their faith to other people. The class will take place throughout the months of February and March, and will con-



sist of four classroom sessions as well as a mission project to put their faith into action.

We will have an interest and information session with Pastor Debbie on Sunday, January 28th right after worship (around 11:45am) in the church Parlor. Please make plans to join us for this meeting if your youth are interested in attending the Confirmation class.




Oakland Happenings
